

KARELIA QUAD EXPEDITION

Duration: 3 days/ 2 nights

Group size: min 1 person (joining a group)







Day 1:

Arrival in Petrozavodsk by train #18 from Moscow. Meeting with the group at the railway station. Transfer for breakfast and afterwards transfer to the starting point (20 km). Getting equipped. Safety measures and training on riding a quad. When everybody is ready starts the adventure. Today we drive 140 km following forest and unpaved roads with special off-road areas. Picnic lunch on the way. The highlight of the day is **Karelian Zoo Park**, where you will get acquainted with typical Karelian animals.

In the evening arrival on the Syamozero Lake. Accommodation in a guest house. Sauna and dinner.

Day 2:

Breakfast. Today we cover the distance of 90 km with challenging off-road areas called the tank road. Picnic lunch on the way. On our way, we will get acquainted with **Tulmozero Iron-Smelting Factory** and with quarries, where ore was mined.

In the evening arrival at Kohtuselga Village. Accommodation in a guest house. Sauna and dinner.

Day 3:

Breakfast. The total distance for today is 115 km. We drive through several Karelian villages, swamps, and forest roads to the shore of the **Ladoga Lake**, which is the second largest lake in Europe. Upon arrival picnic lunch with a picturesque over Lake Ladoga and free time for taking pictures afterwards. After a short rest, you test your skills on quad driving on a 10km off-road sand area, where annual off-road competitions take place.

The highlight of the day is not only the beautiful Ladoga, but also the **Syandema Convent**, which was erected in the 16th century in Karelia. The monastery went over a lot of difficulties, and today it is a riving convent.

In the evening arrival at Umostu guest house to have sauna and dinner.

Transfer to Lodeynoye Pole. Departure by train #17 to Moscow.

Price includes: accommodation, transfers, meals and sauna according to the program, quad rent, equipment (helmet, balaclava, gloves, boots, off-road pants and jacket), instructors, insurance.

Instructors speak English. Additional payment for guide assistance for the program

Price does not include: train tickets.
